Operation 'Hello Eden' explores a means of realizing rapid and substantive topological transformation without the need for the construction of transportation infrastructure in a remote ecosystem. The project acknowledges its use of military technology for site analysis and explores the potential benefits to the use of technologies of environmental control in a site facing significant ecological challenges brought about by the construction of a hydroelectric dam reservoir.
